

SIGNS OF AN OVERDOSE

The following are signs of an opioid overdose:

- | Unconsciousness or difficulty waking from sleep.
- | Discoloration of lips or fingernails.
- | Skin discoloration.
- | Extreme confusion or paranoia.
- | Abnormally low or high body temperature.
- | Abnormally fast or slow breathing.
- | Abnormally fast or slow heart rate.
- | Vomiting.



If someone is showing signs of an overdose, administer naloxone and call 911.
